Moorage: Official & Spectator Boats will be moored with the Vic-Maui fleet in Victoria's Inner Harbour at the Causeway Marina.

Boats starting July 4 ----- Saturday, July 2, 3:00-5:00 pm

Race Starts:

July 4 at 9:55 am----- Amun-Ra, Annie M, Flow, Millennium Seagull, New Haven, Planet Express, Outbreak, Red Sheilla, Xiomara

July 6 at 11:55 am----- Lurline, Peligroso, Phoenix

Suggested times for Spectator Boats:

July 4 Start: Have spectators arrive at the dock by 0800, board spectators by 0815, conduct a safety briefing, leave the dock by 0845, observe the start area from 0900 through 1000, return to the dock to drop off spectators around 1030. Hail the "Vic-Maui Wharfinger" on VHF ch. 66A for a suitable drop off location upon your return.

July 6 Start: Have spectators arrive at the dock by 1030, board spectators by 1045, conduct a safety briefing, leave the dock by 1045, observe the start area from 1130 through 1200, return to the dock to drop off spectators around 1230. A suitable drop off location should be coordinated with marina staff. Unless staying and paying for additional nights of moorage, be away from the dock before 11:00.

Spectator Boat Responsibilities:

- Register in advance by booking Vic-Maui moorage as a spectator boat at <http://www.vicmaui.org/victoria-moorage>.
- Hail "Vic-Maui Wharfinger" on VHF Ch. 66A when approaching the dock. Be aware that rafting may be required, and that shore power may be limited or unavailable.
- Coordinate directly with the competitor boat or spectators that you are teamed with. Let your spectators know what time you'd like them onboard and what they should bring. Consider asking someone to arrange for refreshments and snacks.
- Spectator boat skippers are responsible for the safety and comfort of their crew, spectators and boat, and must ensure that there is adequate safety equipment (especially PFD's) and capacity for the total number of people onboard.



- Pay close attention to the [Port of Victoria traffic scheme](#). See attached chart on page 6.
- Stay well clear of the competitor boats, and manoeuvre carefully among all other boats.
- **Drone flying is prohibited by law**. See attached chart on page 4.

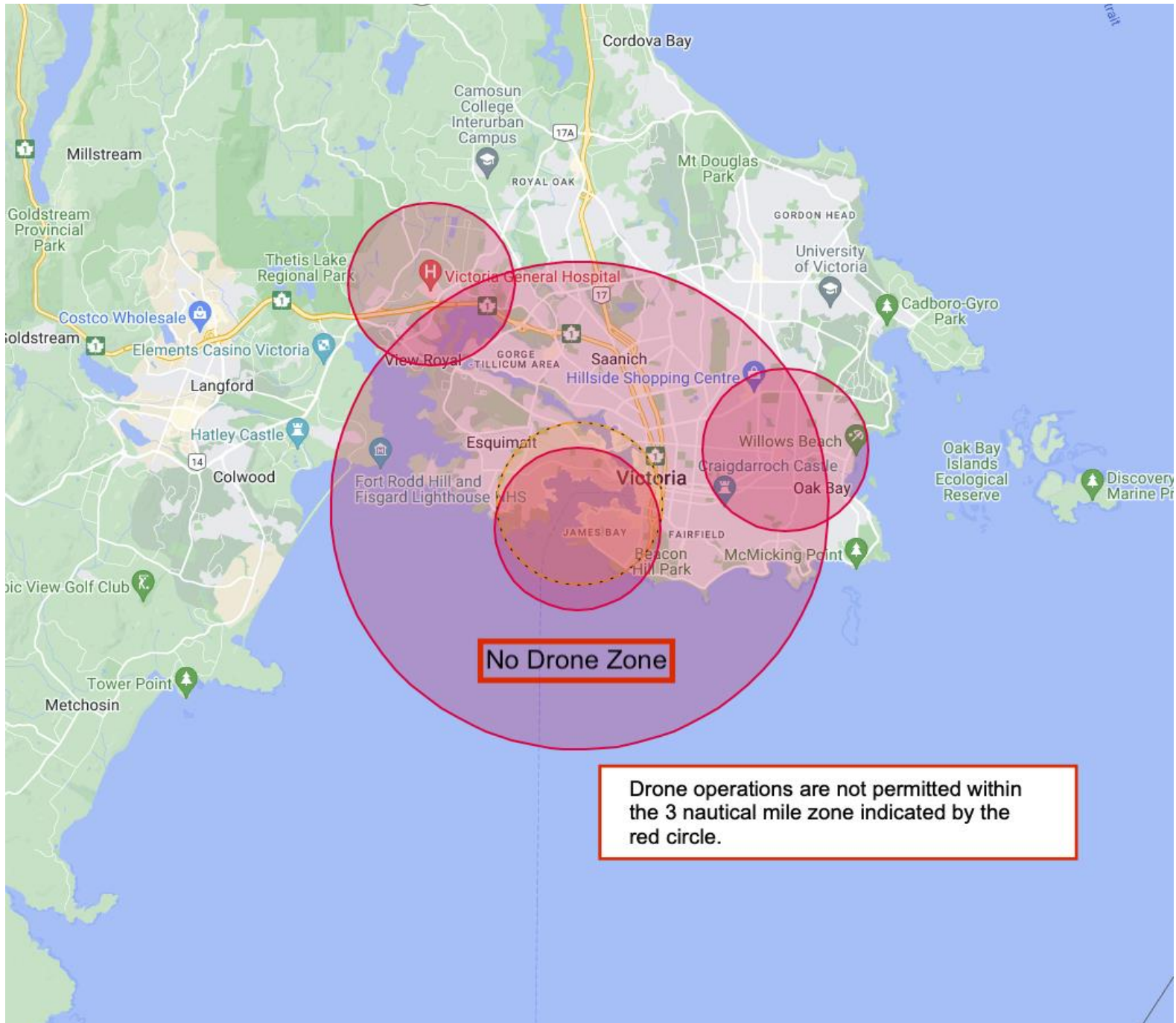
Start Area Instructions:

**No drone zone
PERMIT REQUIRED**

Landmarks and Zones: Ogden Breakwater, Broctchie Ledge, Spectator Area, Race Passage & Lahaina, Race Committee, Competitors Only Please, Spectator Area.

Start Line: The start line is between Broctchie Ledge and the Race Committee Boat.

July 4 Start Signals (PDT)

Warning 0955 Numeral Pennant "1" Raised

Preparatory 0956 Signal flag "P" Raised

0959 Signal flag "P" Lowered

Start 1000 Numeral Pennant "1" Lowered

July 6 Start Signals (PDT)

Warning 1155 Numeral Pennant "1" Raised

Preparatory 1156 Signal flag "P" Raised

1159 Signal flag "P" Lowered

Start 1200 Numeral Pennant "1" Lowered

Courtesy to Competitors

- *Pre-start, spectator boats should remain in the designated Spectator Areas to allow the competitors a free and fair start.
- *After the start, spectator boats may follow the competitors towards Race Passage, making a minimum wake.

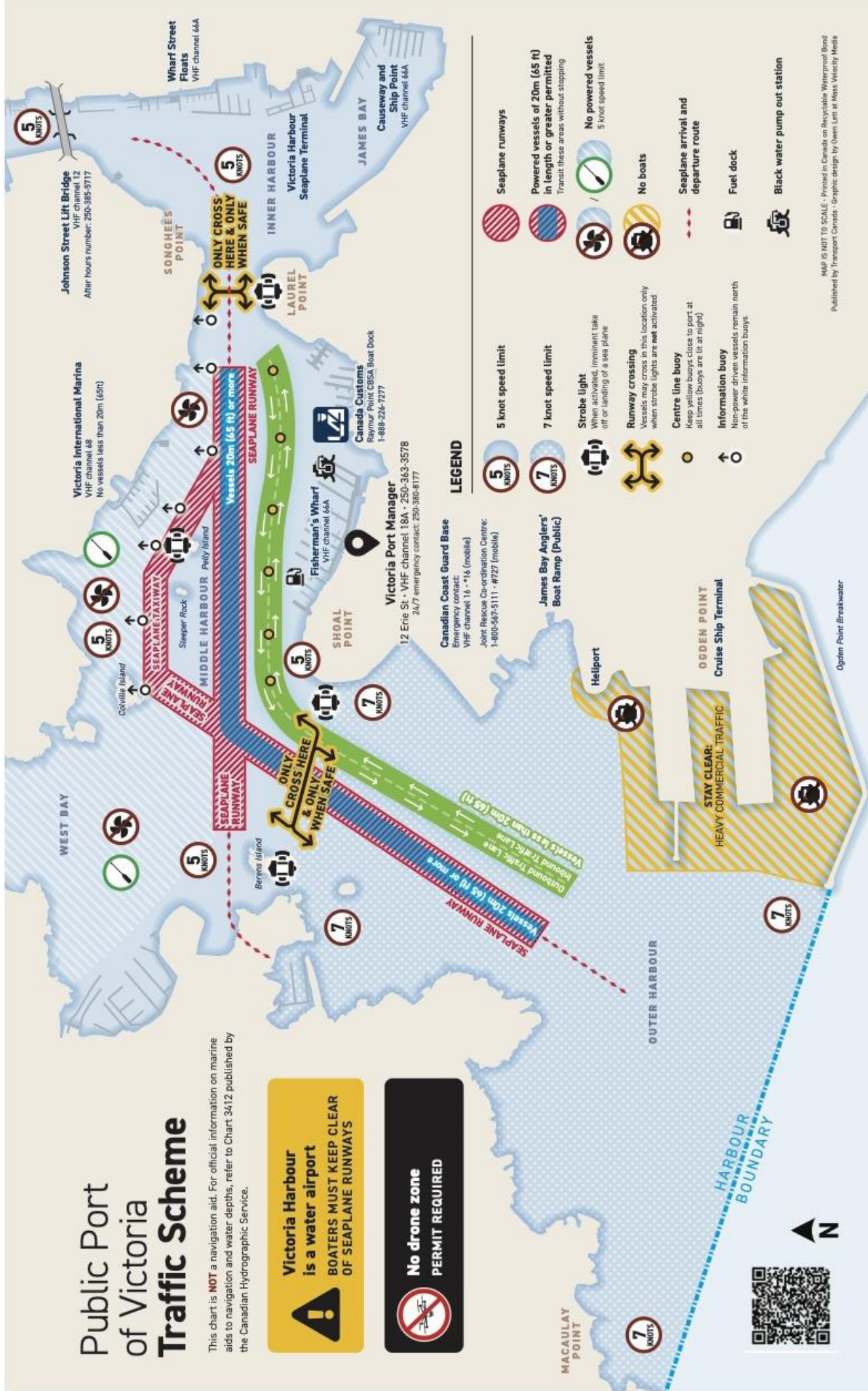

BOATERS MUST KEEP CLEAR
OF SEAPLANE RUNWAYS

PERMIT REQUIRED



LEGEND

- 5 knots**
- 7 knots**
- Seaplane runways**
- Powered vessels of 20m (65 ft) in length or greater permitted**
Transit these areas without stopping
- No powered vessels**
5 knot speed limit
- No boats**
- Seaplane arrival and departure route**
- Fuel dock**
- Black water pump out station**
- Strobe light**
When activated, imminent take off or landing of a seaplane
- Runway crossing**
Vessels may cross in this location only when strobe lights are not activated
- Centre line buoy**
Keep yellow buoys close to port at all times (buoys are lit at night)
- Information buoy**
Non-power driven vessels remain north of the white information buoys
